•	An Ex	cample of The Beauty of the Gospel – Salvation and Help for the Weary and Burdened
	0	Consider Jesus' words to the crowds in Matt 11. "Come unto me all who are weary and heavy-laden"
	0	Group 1 (the wise and) needs no help and has no need for grace or for a Savior.
	0	Group 2, the, or infants, truly know their need and respond in faith, trust, and dependence.
	0	The weary and burdened find rest from the burden of sin and from the resulting way of life produced by disobedience before a good God.
	0	Because God has taken care of our need (new life in Christ), we can know that we have through Him sufficient grace and strength for our task as parents.
	0	Living by faith is different and brings
	0	We DO out of our theology.

Prov. 4:23 – guard, keep, watch over – your heart – for everything you are and do flows from it. And our greatest calling or duty is, Matt 22:37 – to love the Lord our God with all our heart.

0	– desires and motives

0	– often beginning in our inner man
	home, our focus must be on the and not on perfect behavior or outward ousness or keeping rules.
• Jesus	explains the danger of that method. Let's look at Mark 7 (14-23)
0	Here we see Jesus interacting with the religious leaders because they are more concerned that people religious traditions than whether they understand the true reason man is "defiled"
0	The Pharisees emphasized to deal with man's sin
0	Jesus said they were honoring Him with their lips, but their are far from Him.
0	Jesus said the religious taught man's rules as doctrines able to make man righteous.
0	In verses 20-23 Jesus explains that man's problem is in the heart (the)
• The w	onder of the gospel applied to my life:
0	First in salvation – being born again by the work of God (Jn 3)
0	Second, in ongoing, daily life. In a daily walk of faith, God does his work of sanctification – changing me more and more into the image of Christ (2 Cor 3:18).
	■ If I battle with fear about the children, I need to remember God's power to save and I need to trust and depend on Him rather than attempting to my children's lives.

	 Dwelling on the work of God through to love me and that His work of grace in me is undeserved will help me rightly respond to children when sin and conflict are involved.
• Based	on the "Target" of the Heart – What is Guiding Us in Our Homes?
0	Let's be sure our standards and communication do not emphasize rules, behavior, outward appearance, or standards measured by man
0	Let's be sure our concern and are oriented on the heart – our own hearts and the hearts of our children.
	Is it important to have standards and to teach right behavior?
	Does a home need to have various rules or family standards?
	• But what guides how we design and employ standards and rules in the home?
0	Let's be sure we a life of "guarding the heart" (Prov. 4:23)
	 Shaping right thinking, on God's Word.
	to desires that honor and glorify God. Parents leading by example.
	 Guiding in that is based on faith and that glorifies God, not man.
	 Empowering the children to to guard their hearts by helping them to learn and understand gospel truths.
0	Pray for and have the confidence to and guide conversations (both instructing and correcting) that are shaped by the Gospel and directed to the heart.
• The R	hight Application of Standards and Rules in the Home
0	We know that we do not grow in godliness by a lack of or by standing still (1 Tim 4:7 = discipline yourself for godliness).
0	We also know that good help us to train or guide our hearts.
0	But Jesus is also concerned that we not create an where people honor God with their lips and their hearts are far from Him. We will do this when we seek to please above God, or when we desire to exercise over the children.
	 We need to build our relationship, conversation, and interaction with each other and with the children on these gospel and heart-oriented principles.

•	Mom & Dad can the standards and the rules of the home and they can work together as they create the environment in their home and raise their children.
	• God to help you design family priorities and patterns which you discern from the gospel.
	• Be confident to God's work through His Word as you seek to honor Him with these priorities and patterns. Don't feel like you have to adopt "the Smith's schedule," "the Brown's method of discipline," or "the Jones' diet."
•	Take note of the way God His people & His church
	• God asks His people to "" both how He provided for them and how He acts on their behalf (e.g. Isa 64:4, I Cor 2:10).
